Live Art Venue!

creates a starting point

A need to ask the questions Who is this work for? Who is the audience? for performance, rehearsal, eating, families, meetings (with a business model) exchange of ideas

Experimental work is not a priority in established venues

Need for more 'integrated programming' of live art related to audience development.

Arts Union Lots of pods of activity: a need to join the dots

No overarching legal support for artists could also potentially be what joins the pods together

> Stronger connections and pathways between higher education and local arts scene

Is it the Leeds art scene too inward looking? Does it create a ceiling for artists?

Need to develop an international dialogue

Bring International work to Yorkshire and also create platforms for local artists to abroad

More bridges between artists & policy makers

> Lack of critical discourse around live art & socially engaged practice.
